

The Lewis Fry Richardson Lifetime Achievement Award

The Lewis F. Richardson Lifetime Achievement Award honors a recipient who has made exemplary scholarly contributions to the scientific study of militarized conflict. The prize is dedicated to encouraging scholars to pursue innovative avenues of research in the tradition of the eminent British meteorologist and peace researcher, Lewis Fry Richardson. It is given on a tri-annual basis to scholars who analyze international interactions systematically and rigorously and have spent most of their academic life in Europe.

The previous recipients for the award are Michael Nicholson (2001), Erich Weede (2004), Nils Petter Gleditsch (2007), Ron P. Smith (2010), Mats Hammarström & Peter Wallensteen (2013), and Paul Collier (2016). The award will be presented in June 2019 at the European Network for Peace Scientists annual conference in the Hague, Netherlands.

Nominations must be sent to the chair of the nomination committee by 30 April 2019. Nominations are limited to a strict one page maximum, and should comment on how a candidate fits with the criteria for the award.
